Admin Report

Outdoor School:

- Grade 4's will go to ODS next week April 22 24th
- Staffing will be: Ms. Bird and Ms. Johnson as well as a few EAs

September Class Placement:

- 3 prong approach parent/caregiver, students, and staff input is requested
- Caregiver input request went out in school newsletter for April
- The caregiver input form will look different this year they can no longer request students and teachers on the forms.

School fees

- Each year, information outlining potential fees that may be charged next school year is sent to parents. This supports transparency and keeps our staff and parents within the budget parameters. These fees will <u>only</u> be charged if students participate in enrichment opportunities within the classroom or school. PAC may also provide monetary support to offset some of these fees.
- As per <u>Policy 706: School Fees</u>, it is the school principal, in consultation with staff and PAC Exec who is responsible for establishing fee amounts for the school. All school fee amounts are set at cost-recovery.
- Admin has discussed this plan with staff, and it has been approved by them
- PAC Exec have also provided their feedback and has been approved by them. The PAC does not have any feedback at this time.

- You will notice that the fees have increased by \$5 for Ks and \$3 for Gr 1-7. This is due to the increase in price for all items. Please review the table below for the proposed School Fees for the coming school year.

Third Party School Supplies:

- Megan Hughes has looked into options: Staples has been ruled out due to cost and Staples platform was deemed too complicated. Vendors otherwise all have similar prices and systems: each teacher makes a list, PAC provides the list to vendor and vendor makes the packs based on consumables (paper, duotangs, notebooks, glue, pencils, etc) on that list, and parents can add other 'a la cart' items like rulers, scissors, and calculators that may be reused and not needed. The vendor that seemed the best is: Edupac.
- Edupac: It is a local company with a Seymour Heights parent connection. Prices are reasonable (i.e \$50-\$68 for basic package) and platform is easy to use. There are incentives for parents to order early. We would get a \$500 for signing up (could be used for families needing financial support with school supplies), and a \$1 cash back for the family.
- It was decided we will go with Edupac as a trial for 2024/2025 year

School Presentations:

- TCO2 presentation was cancelled due to speaker illness it will be rescheduled and parents will be notified
- Saleema Noon Sexual Health parent info night May 13th.

Chair Report (Erin Bulycz)

- Konstella Update: Invites to parents have been sent out. Parents of 79 students have joined of the 290 students at the school. Emails have gone out via class reps and we anticipate it will increase registration. Heights Night will go through Konstella (Stripe) for ticket purchases so that may increase registration too. We will work out how these purchases will work out with Stripe and our PAC account.
- **Childminding**: PAC has been able to provide childcare to parents for parents who are volunteering for events or during PAC meetings. How can we make a fair system of which grade 6/7 kids with babysitting certificates get the opportunity to provide this? We will put this out in Konstella to get a pool of interested babysitters.
- **Nominations**: If anyone wants to nominate themselves for an executive position we will vote next month at AGM on positions. All executive positions are open to nominations annually in keeping with a democratic and inclusive system
- **Website**: We are looking for a volunteer to take over website management from Allison Anderson (1 hour per month). Allison can help train a volunteer

After School Programs:

• Waiting for email back from Braemar Elementary to consult them on how they do their various afterschool programs

Treasurer Report (Kate Watson)

- Hot lunch program is generating a lot of income this year
- See Treasurer report for specific numbers of current budget
- There was an ask under Equity and Inclusion budget if we have \$800 extra to provide for sexual health education for neurodivergent students who are not able to partake in or benefit from Saleema Noon workshops. The school has let us know that there has only been a few students at SH identified which need this alternative program. PAC will touch base with FOS to see if other PACS want to split this cost if they have some students that would also benefit to bring in this speaker together, so all students can have access to relevant sexual health education.
- Teacher Appreciation day will be run by Kate and Sarah M. this year. We have a small budget for this.
- Kate has put in the purchase order for all the IT Tech and they will be here by end of year!

FOS (Sarah Manvell)

- Sherwood: Is using Konstella and enjoying it, they have a spring carnival coming up
- Blueridge: They do a system of each grade does one fundraising project. Examples that classes are taking on this year: Cineplex movie night, Brewhouse night out, silent auction, one class does staff

appreciation

- Dorothy Lynus: Guest speakers at the PAC meeting to get more parents out (i.e. parents at the school who have relevant professions such as a pediatric dietician, etc), Joanna Lane is now new principal at DL.
- Windsor: Has had a difficult start to the term related to losses. They are low on fundraising this term

NSSC - (Sarah Manvell)

- Unfortunately, there was a child hit by a car on Marine Dr. on the way to Norgate school. This is a reminder to be careful when driving and dropping off kids around the school area.
- We are looking for new crossguard volunteers for the 2024/2025 school year. It can be just once weekly or less! Any amount of help before or after school would be appreciated.

NVPAC Anti-Racism committee (Erin Bulycz):

- No update, next meeting is May.
- The Committee is working on K-12 Anti-Racism action plan and how to actually carry out these plans in schools. They are also working on a calendar of events to inform students and families of a large diversity of holidays/celebrations and practical ways to celebrate these celebrations within the schools.

Multicultural Committee Update: (Erin Bulycz)

- June 6th early evening there will be a Multicutural potluck outside the school
- This is an opportunity for families to share their food and/or celebrations. Azzah is leading this event and it will have dishes from different cultures (decorations/food etc). All Seymour Heights families are invited to join and share with the school community.

Fundraising (Kylie Mains)

- Vesta has some ideas to discuss with Kylie in next week, then Executive team will write it up and bring it to AGM in May
- Blueridge Good Neighbour Day -PAC won't have a table this year review next year
- June 14th is FUN DAY NO fundraiser this year at fun day but we will hand out a treat to all children in the school that meets school's food policy guidelines
- Next Neufeld Farm Frozen Food Dates: May 3 May 21 for orders. Pick up is Tuesday, May 28th, 4pm.
- Heights Night: Sara and Shar are organizing this event. Thursday, June 13th is the confirmed date. This year it will be at Good Co. at Northwoods. They are offering free rental, cheap drinks, tickets will be \$40 and burger/beer included. Guests can order off menu too. PAC will earn \$22 from each ticket. Tickets on sale early in May. Ideas for fundraisers will be: Online and Live Auction (Kylie has collected a lot of things for the auction fundraiser, Wine Wall \$20 wine bottles donated, and people pay \$20 and get a bottle of wine, A spinning wheel, 50/50 Corrie and Vesta have offered to sell 50/50. Nic is going to do an online auction start on June 1st and will run until June 13th.
- Fundraisers for 2024/2025 school year to get approved at the AGM as they go into the budget.

Yearbook Committee (Corrie Diligenti)

- Security breach, believe no names were leaked. Breach happened at the business side, not the PAC side. They don't believe names and photos were taken from last year.
- Yearbook website is having issues but they will get it done.
- 240 consent forms received

Munch a Lunch Program (Jen Avey)

- Survey is up online Munch A Lunch crew will try to have Subway and Sushi in some capacity next year
- 30% survey responders think lunches are too expensive. Current profit mark up is 24%. We will consider lowering this profit margin on some items to make some more affordable options for families.
- Biggest concern is volunteering for handing out hot lunches we need to recruit new volunteers to help
- Can we ask students to help in some capacity? This would lower adult volunteers needed to just 1 per shift. Perhaps we could determine a system of sign up, guidelines and incentive to create more accountability/structure for students to help. There were some issues in the past with behavior, but if we created more guidelines/structure this may address it. Discussion about how student involvement in school fundraising and privileges being offered may be good for leadership, inclusion and community building which are values of the PAC
