UPDATES:

- Windsor enrollment this year is just over 900 students.
- Windsor has a Japanese exchange program currently and students from Windsor will be travelling to Japan in April 2020.
- Vaping at Windsor has become a serious issue with student's receiving suspensions for vaping in or around school property.
- Windsor would allow our three feeder schools to hold a vaping speaker/event within the school for parents in order to educate students prior to attending Windsor and to inform parents and students of the science and serious nature of vaping.
- Windsor has a mindfulness training program
- Mother / Father days gifts changed to family day gifts with negative feedback from parents at Blueridge and proposed crafting event for families in lieu of this decision - tbd

- Fundraising options were discussed between the schools and money raised within each school for each of these events. This writer did not have the financial information to share with the group at this time. - Blueridge is doing a fundraiser through the B.C. fruits and Veggies program with a 40% kickback to the school.
- Windsor will not be putting on their annual Gala this year, however will engage with grade 8/9 parents to proceed next year.
- Windsor will be involved in the Interact Club with donations of socks, coats, food etc where 18 tickets for we day would be handed to students as incentives.
- Windsor, Blueridge and Seymour Heights participated in toonies for Terry.
- Windsor will have a Halloween Costume contest.
- Windsor had received \$800 in donations
- PST rebates from the district included Windsor at \$1400 and Blueridge receiving approx \$700.
