## SEL Team

- Teachers recommended two items - TheraBands (for tying around desk/chair legs and noise-reducing headphones)
- Teachers are providing names of students to the SEL Team so that they can provide TheraBands to the desks
- We purchased 4 headphones and are having a two-week trial where classes will provide feedback to the SEL Team - we'll then make an informed decision on moving forward with purchasing more good quality headphones for all classes (ie, teachers would like 2-3 headphones in their classes only) at this time
- PAC funds helped purchase both items - thank you PAC!


## Outdoor Play Based Learning

- Outdoor Place-based Learning Mentorship Series was offered as part of an effort to increase opportunity and capacity for Outdoor Place-based Learning in the District.
- Teacher Mentors worked directly with 5 of our teachers and their classes in supporting instruction and assessment around Outdoor Place-based Learning (OPL)
- 5 classes worked one-on-one for 40-60 min per week for 3-4 weeks in a row
- 5 classes - Kathleen Baker (Gr 5/6), Suzanne Johnson (Gr 4/5), Ivana Gondekova (Gr 2), Deb McCartney (Gr 2/3), and Katie Nicholls (Gr 1)
- Teachers and students enjoyed learning in nature and they will share their learnings with staff at an upcoming staff meeting

## Treasurer Report (Kate Watson)

- We heard from the DPAC meeting that there was a district audit that Seymour Heights was a part of last year and it's possible our school might have been allocated money that is to be split with the PAC. This is something we should follow up on with Sanj.
- Received a gaming grant, \$5,000 (money received)
- Costume Sale made profit of around \$1600
- Sarah asked if the budget could be attached to the posted minutes.
- Discussion on providing technology (laptops/ipads) to the school; if there is a need; where the equipment could be stored; space required potentially for its use; sources of funding available. Topic tabled until November PAC meeting.

## Crossing Guard (Sarah Manvell)

- We have a new volunteer - Geoff Harrower (Erin's lovely husband) - thank you! We are always looking for more volunteers, join us.
- The DNV has installed a few delineators around the crosswalk - hoped there would be more. I had also asked for more "school zone" signage but what we have is deemed acceptable.
- Please speak to your caregivers or other people who drive your children to school about traffic and road safety. They have a responsibility to the children in their care and the safety of others. Unfortunately there is a child care provider that is a consistent problem as they do not park safely (and legally) and then unload children onto a busy street and then cross the road with. They also tend to drive pretty quickly too.. This is also why the pick/up droff zone is so important. PLEASE DO NOT PARK THERE!
- Do not park on yellow painted sidewalks. We cannot see both lanes of traffic when you park here.
- Belloc Street, Lytton Road (below the Blueridge Gardens) and Trillium Place continue to be better places to park!
- We have a few equipment requests. Corrie has kindly drawn up a document with our "blue sky wishes".
- Please report unsafe driving to the RCMP https://ocre-sielc.rcmp-grc.gc.ca/nvan/en The owner of the vehicle will be called or have a letter sent to them. While this is not a permanent mark on your record, they do however keep a record of the incidents I believe. Our thoughts as crossing guards with regards to unsafe driving is that the driver will be asked to rectify their behaviour (parking/speeding) etc and if not then a report will be made. ## DPAC Report (Sara Elton)

- Fundraising Initiatives: Family portraits through Mountain West, Two Rivers, Holiday Market (everything is \$2), Card Project, Purdeys, Growing Smiles (Poinsettias over the holidays \& bedding plants for spring), Pub Night (we discussed how schools depend on parents being able to acquire goods to sell, which is key to the success of the event (thank you Kylie \& Nicole)
- App for school communications: Many schools are using app’s such as Fresh School and Konstella to communicate with families. Konstella was highly recommended as its free/cost effective depending on how you use it, it's more responsive and has better translation capabilities. It can link to Munch a lunch, our school calendar and our personal mobile calendar. It will send notifications to parents with new updates and will eliminate the need for class reps, Facebook page and email communications.
- There's a $\$ 1000$ grant for schools that do a fundraising initiative together. This is great for elementary schools that feed into the same high school. Needs to be done with 3 schools.
- Discussed having a spring carnival with activities and food? Perhaps do this with 3 schools? Blueridge, Lynnmor and us in spring? We'll need to apply for the $\$ 1000$ dollar grant
- Giving back: Soap for hope, giving tree, scare hunger. It was suggested to check out the Xmas bureau as it's a great resource https://www.Imcb.ca/ (we're already sponsoring, likely through NSFS)

## Fundraising (Donna Fullerton and Kylie Mains)

## Windsor

- Low on monetary donations
- Traffic is a concern with construction
- Spending $\$ 15 \mathrm{~K}$ to improve wifi in the school
- Looking at bringing back a gala that will include the FOS

Blueridge

- Welcome BBQ - raised $\$ 2400$ but BIG struggle to find volunteers. Rentals were done through Lonsdale Rentals
- Bought a second popcorn machine for popcorn Monday - starting to make a profit
- Growing Smiles - plantars and wreaths for winter (setup similar to Newfields)
- Santa's Breakfast organized by grade 4s this year. Usually makes around \$2000.
- Blueridge does GRADE SPECIFIC fundraising...each grade takes on an event. PAC decides what it is based on the group of parents for the year. EG: Kindergarten does Neufield, Grade 2 does Movie night etc. One PAC rep for each group for each event to funnel questions etc.

NSSC - (Sarah Manvell) Next meeting is on Dec 7th (every two months now)

- Navigating Emergency Preparedness aspect with regards to the PAC. Right now, according to the links that are available (which according to the NVPAC chair are incorrect) There is a large part of this placed on the PAC and over the last week we've had discussions with our PAC Execs, and the liability involved. This is far too much responsibility for two parents to take on.
- Discussed this with the FOS and their thoughts and feelings are similar. The NVPAC will dig into this a bit more and figure out what the PAC is responsible for, if anything. Will keep moving forward to ensure the school is prepared. Still looking for volunteers.
- Classroom Emergency Kits - Lauren and Sarah decided that the focus was going to be on water/warmth/snacks. PAC put $\$ 1500$ aside last year. Discussion: spending budgeted money on water/warmth/food
- Defibrillators: Sanj reports that there is a new district OHS position and this is on their task list. More information to come.
