
the Outdoor Classroom and keeping it beautiful.



BIG HOUSE

The **Grade 4's** have just returned from a fantastic trip to the Big House in Squamish. The weather was gorgeous and the kids had a great time. There were many activities to keep them busy throughout the day and they got a real sense of how our First Nations people lived 300 hundred years ago.

The kids were divided into 5 families: Cedar Bark Workers, Wool Weavers, Fishers and Hunters, Wood Workers, and Plant Gatherers. Each family learned about their specific role in making the whole group function together. The kids did the majority of the cooking, including bannock baked over a fire, cleaning, dishwashing and collecting of firewood. Everyone slept in the Big House together on sleeping platforms and mats! Overall, it was a great experience for our Grade 4's and thank you to the parent volunteers and teachers who came along!
